



Book Review

An introduction to the memoirs of Terry Wale by Lesley Mackie



Terry Wale (my husband!) has been writing his memoirs for over 25 years and has finally completed them. A chance meeting with a lovely publisher back in December got us focused and we've spent the entire lock down period on this project. We felt it was now or never! While others have read half a dozen books during this time – I've read one book six times! And as he started as a child actor in 1951, it's a long story at 540 pages - and I don't enter his life until page 326! There were times when I thought I'd be carted off as I encountered daily battles over what could and could not be said about the people who had passed through his life! Libel suits were to be avoided at all costs! I hope I'll get my life back now - and get on with my own memoirs! Incidentally, I think it's a pretty good read!

Summary from the book cover

It is not a 'Rags to Riches' story; far from it in fact. I was never in rags, and throughout a career that spanned more than six decades, I never achieved the riches that go hand-in-hand with stardom. What it's all about is my life as an actor, a story that is uniquely mine, but which will resonate (in many respects) with at least 85% of my fellow actors, also deprived of fame and fortune. I have written a very personal

account of a career that began at the age of thirteen, and covers almost seventy years, incorporating not only the peaks and the troughs, but also 'The lovely loving and the hateful hates' that have played such an important part in my life, and provided me with the motivation to tell my story.
