Dear All,

We have received the following from the Moderator of the Church of Scotland, Rt Hon Lord Wallace of Tankerness QC:

"As we enter the final few weeks before COP26, the global climate change conference taking place in Glasgow (31st October – 12th November), we are writing to encourage every congregation in the Church of Scotland to do all that we can do to ensure that this gathering succeeds in addressing the huge challenges that we are facing.

#### A call to prayer and worship

Our first message to you is to encourage our congregations to pray; in our worship and preaching in the Sundays leading up to and during COP26, and to join the many opportunities for in-person and online worship that are now being planned, across Glasgow and elsewhere. We would also ask that you will consider arranging local events where people can come together to pray for justice for the poorest and for our planet.

#### A call to witness on the streets

We hope you will encourage as many people from your congregations as possible to take part in the global day of action and mass mobilisation which will take place on the **6th November** in Glasgow and around the world.

We invite you to hold a vigil outside your own church on 6th November as a public sign of

solidarity and support for climate justice and care for creation.

Hear the voices of those people most deeply impacted

Our third request is to ensure that the wisdom and experience of our sisters and brothers in the countries most affected by global heating and in societies least able to cope with measures to mitigate the impact is uppermost in our thoughts and actions. The poorest are often excluded from decisions which hurt them most. "

SUNDAY 17 OCTOBER 2021

This is a national initiative from the Church of Scotland to encourage members of the Church to support their local congregation during September and October after what have been and continue to be most difficult times in many ways including the income available to churches to carry out all their work.

St. Matthew's Church has chosen Sunday 17 October 2021 for the focus of this initiative. We, as a congregation, have suffered particularly from being unable to rent out our halls and sanctuary from March 2020. It is only now that organisations and others are beginning to recommence their activities. While our income from bank standing orders has held up, our income from the WFO envelopes, the weekly gift aid envelopes and the open plate has fallen dramatically due to the long periods when we were unable to open due to the pandemic. There also continues to be an understandable reluctance from some members to return to church. We have only been able to meet all our financial commitments since March 2020 due, in particular, to a generous legacy from a former Elder, a generous donation from a member of the congregation and the income generated from the letting of the flat. This income was also reduced due to the enforced closures during lockdowns.

We would therefore ask you to give your support to this initiative insofar as you are able either by returning the yellow envelope, placing your donation in an envelope clearly marked "National Giving Day" or making payment by bank transfer again marking the payment "National Giving Day". If you are a taxpayer please also mark your envelope "Gift Aid".
