Janet's Jottings

I recently bumped into a friend I hadn't seen for a long time. While we were chatting, I suddenly realised the time, apologised and stated that I had to go and do some messages before I went to work. He burst out laughing saying that he hadn't heard the term 'messages' being used in years. It's not heard often these days, but it certainly was in my childhood. When my parents sent me out on a 'message' I never quite knew what I was going to be asked to do and learned at a very young age not to question it, just to get on and do it as quickly and efficiently as possible.

Generally, it was the commonly known Scots interpretation of 'doing the messages' which meant going for some shopping.

It could though also mean a variety of other errands.

For instance, a lady up the road entrusted me every few days with the message of carrying a bucket load of vegetable peelings and food scraps to deliver to my granny's house to feed to her hens. Then the return 'message' from granny (with a firm instruction 'remember NO skipping on the way!) was to deliver half a dozen eggs safely back.

Another one was to be sent on a vegetable swap. When there was a glut of vegetables in our garden, Dad would send us to a neighbour with tatties, kale, beetroot or whatever and we would arrive back home with an armful of whatever was in excess in the recipient's garden.

On one memorable occasion, I was sent on an urgent message over to the local garage to request some grease as a wee boy on his holiday had got his leg stuck down a drain! Doing the messages was never dull!

Although doing the 'messages' is a peculiarly Scottish term, being a messenger is the same in any language.

Christ is our greatest role model when it comes to delivering messages.

He also sent his disciples out on messages. One of the most famous being when he sent them out to find food to feed a huge crowd and they returned with 5 loaves and 2 fish.

Sometimes His messages can be challenging – Luke 6 v 41 *"Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye…."* Or thought provoking - Matthew 10 v 34: "Do not suppose that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I did not come to the earth to bring peace, but a sword".

Or encouraging - Matthew 11 v 28: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest".

Or reassuring - John 14 v 1: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God and trust in me also".

Christ went to great lengths to see that God's messages got to the very folks that needed to hear them most.

Whether it was to the rich, the poor, the marginalised, the sick or disadvantaged, His message never wavered and that was "To love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind".

He has instructed us to continue with His good work and deliver His messages on His behalf. So, the next time you go out on your messages – take Jesus with you and share the Good News!
