#### Water of Life

Water, water everywhere! October brought us a deluge of rain and flooding. Like many others, I was drawn down to view the height of the river Tay. I was amazed not only at how quickly the river had risen, but also by the speed and power of it. It was astounding how Stanner's Island all but disappeared and how the quickly the North Inch was engulfed.

Water is a fascinating substance. In its natural state it is clear and pure, looks very ordinary and tastes of very little. On a calm loch it reflects mountains and trees like a giant mirror. It cascades down waterfalls. It has the ability to freeze over and turn solid. Water also has a mind of its own; It can creep into crevices, slither under doors, rapidly increase its flow, gather momentum and before long a benign puddle can turn into a torrent; always reminding us not to underestimate its power. In Africa, deserts and dry riverbeds can spring to life in hours when the rainy season comes. Fish, birds and other creatures come to drink and eat the bountiful crops that have sprung from nowhere. All made possible from the power of water.

Water features a lot in the Bible. As children we learn the story of the great flood sent by God to cover the earth when He realises how sinful and wicked humans had become. As the water recedes, God sends us a rainbow as a sign of His covenant. He promises that never again will the waters become a flood to destroy all life on earth. We also hear of Jesus walking on the water. He encourages his disciples to join him, but they are afraid. His actions demonstrate that they, or indeed we, need not be afraid. If He can walk on water amid a storm, then He is there to walk with us in through our overwhelming problems in the storms of life.

In John 7:37-39 Jesus speaks of 'living water'. "Let anyone who is thirsty come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as Scripture has said, rivers of living water will flow from within them." The verse draws upon the life-giving properties of water. 'Living water' is a metaphor used to depict the spiritual sustenance and salvation that Jesus Christ offers. It represents the Holy Spirit's ability to refresh us, quench our spiritual thirst, cleanse us, and bring forth life wherever it flows.



I was honoured to be able to witness the power of ordinary water and living water working together last week, when our friend Dawn Anderson was baptised in Loch Clunie – one brave lady! It was a very moving and emotional experience as we watched Dawn wade into the chilly water. The Rev. Scott Burton used the familiar baptismal liturgy as he immersed Dawn fully in the water, but somehow those words came to life as she rose from the cold water, having been blessed with the warmth of the Holy Spirit. For Dawn embarking on her new journey of faith and fellowship in St Matthew's and for those of us that might be struggling with our faith, I leave you with some reassuring words from Isaiah 43:2 which show that we must never underestimate the power of the living water.

When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.

Last but by no means least, this service will include the **Sacrament of Holy Communion**; all who love the Lord are invited to His table.



Sunshine Boxes are toy boxes filled with new toys, books and games for children from 0-16 years who are undergoing painful or frightening procedures in hospital. The children can choose a gift to make the difficult and daunting experience of being in hospital somewhat more comfortable. It would be good if our Guild could fill a toy box with small, inexpensive toys to help this charity for Christmas. We could also provide cosy socks, little knitted hats for premature babies, jigsaws and colouring books with colour pencils. All these boxes of gifts are distributed around the childrens' outpatient clinics and wards in the hospitals around Tayside, so this is a local charity helping local children. All donations should be new, and a maximum cost of £5 is suggested for the small toys. The next Guild meeting is on **Monday 30**<sup>th</sup> **October** and will be in the Mission Hall as the Sanctuary is booked out for another group. The speaker is Robert Alexander of The Vine Trust. On 13th November the topic is Paper Craft, while Rev Gillian Munro is our speaker on 27th November.

### A letter of thanks from Archie and the Scouts

Dear Friends at St Matthew's

I wanted to write to thank you personally for the support you have given me over the last 18 months. The run up to our amazing trip to South Korea was hard but I learned a lot from all the events I was part of planning and help run. On a personal level it was fun fundraising with the 11 people from Perth I then travelled with as well as mixing and doing activities with the wider group of 40 from East Region. The tight bond we made in the early days I think helped us a huge amount when we finally got to Korea.

We arrived in Seoul on the 25<sup>th</sup> July - after a day's travelling - full of excitement for what lay ahead. I then found out I had been chosen to carry the flag for the UK at the Opening Ceremony. Amazingly the first Scottish person to do this – what an honour!! We had 6 busy days in Seoul taking in the sights. On the 2<sup>nd</sup> August we travelled the 6hrs from Seoul to the Jamboree site in Saemangeum Buan-gun. It was hot, sandy and sticky as we rushed to put up tents and get ready for the Opening Ceremony. There was a talk from Bear Grylls and others, a drone display and lastly the Flag Ceremony where I was the 150th of 162 country flags to walk onto the stage.



It was super hot and sticky even at night, with the temperature not really dropping below 25 and some were struggling with the heat and bugs. Thankfully our Unit of 40 was good at keeping each other going, drinking enough and motivated. We knew we had 12 days to enjoy the site and its activities so it was to be approached as 'a marathon not sprint'. Sadly after just 3 days we heard that the site organisers were just not coping with keeping on top of food deliveries, health needs and cleanliness and with huge unspeakable disappointment the UK Contingent made the decision that all 4500 participants were to leave site and head back to Seoul hoping this would help take the pressure off.



We headed back to hotels in Seoul and started 8 days more sightseeing, cultural activities before our return flight on 13<sup>th</sup> August. On the 11<sup>th</sup> August there was a Closing Ceremony at the World Cup Stadium this brought most of 47000 participants back together one last time. The main event was the passing of the Jamboree Flag from Korea to Poland for 2027 World Scout Jamboree.

Our experience of the Jamboree was not what was expected we had hoped for an amazing International Camp mixing with people from all over the world but sadly this was not to be. But we made the best of our time in Seoul and I have made friends and had experiences which will stay with me forever. Many thanks again for your support, *Archie Mitchell*
