**Dear Friends** 

As the newsletter goes to print, our minister Fiona is on compassionate leave, following the recent death of her father. We send her and her family our sincere sympathy, and assure them that we continue to keep them in our prayers.

So, instead of a letter from the manse, this comes from your recently appointed new Session Clerk (from 1<sup>st</sup> June.) I want first of all to pay tribute to Raymond Young, the retiring Session Clerk, and thank him for the careful and thoughtful way he has helped to steer St Matthew's over the last couple of years. We owe him a great debt of gratitude for his steady hand and expertise through changing and challenging times. And as I take on the role of Session Clerk, I am grateful also to Janet Martin, who has assumed my previous role as Pastoral Care Convener.

There are many changes afoot in the wider Church of Scotland – at local, Presbytery and National level. In May, I had the privilege of attending our General Assembly, and listened to the challenges the Church is facing because of dwindling congregations and fewer people feeling 'called' to full-time ministry. But it was not all doom and gloom - we also heard about new initiatives and many exciting stories of growth and new mission projects.

Change can be unsettling. It can be difficult to move from the familiar but change also opens up new possibilities and opportunities. We need to be aware and alert to them at St Matthew's. It is good to see new faces on a Sunday morning, and we look forward to everyone feeling that they have a part to play in our church family. To quote the title of our new hymn book, which Rev Fiona has been introducing to us, "God Welcomes All".

And of course, there is one thing which does not change – our loving God is the same 'yesterday, today and forever'; He (or she) is always there for us to turn to, to seek guidance from, in times of joy and sorrow, in our work and leisure, at church and in our daily lives. So I share with you this prayer:

May our present lives reach out, with You
To the communities in which we are placed,
And to the people we seek to serve
May our incarnation in village, town and city
Be a living reminder of Your presence
In Your Church, with Your people,

# **Christian Aid at 80**

This year, 2025, sees the 80th anniversary of the organisation which was to become Christian Aid. In 1945, aware of the refugee crisis in Europe following the 2nd World War, a Scottish padre, Rev Douglas Lister, appealed to the churches in Britain and Ireland to send help - food, clothing, etc, - to those in

need. Despite their own post-war privations, Christians in the UK responded generously; the original, rather unwieldy, title of "Inter Church Committee for Reconstruction in Europe" grew to become Christian Aid, the churches own ecumenical overseas development agency, and it has been responding to emergencies, encouraging development projects, and campaigning against injustice ever since.

To mark this 80th anniversary, Christian Aid has been encouraging churches to plant trees, as a sign of faith in the future. Our garden committee however felt that the garden was too small for a tree, but





instead we have planted a rhododendron - deep red to reflect the Christian Aid colours - and it flowers in May, which is of course the month of Christian Aid Week. I am grateful to Nicola Macnee for finding just the right plant, and the right space for it. We hope it will serve as a reminder to us all of the good work which Christian Aid continues to do, and encourage us to continue to give it our support and prayers.

Can I also draw your attention to the Big Brekkie, being organised locally by Christian Aid supporters on **Saturday August 30th** in the North Church Halls, Perth, **from 10 - 12**. This will be an opportunity to celebrate! There will be tea, coffee and food (including cake!) We will look back at

what has been achieved, how we were able to give support locally, and hear how best we can continue to support Christian Aid going forward. Stalls and speakers including Val Brown, Head of CA Scotland - doors open at 9.30, coffee and tea and food from 10.00 a.m., speakers etc. from 10.45-11.30 a.m., close 12 noon. Open to all - no tickets but donations welcome. For catering purposes, registration is desired, but not essential. (More details to come about registering on Eventbrite) Do come along and enjoy looking back, and looking forward! (Did we mention cake?)



#### 2026 Tanzania Experience

Hi my name is Ruaridh Macnee, I am an S6 pupil at Perth Grammar School. You might know my Mum Nicola. I have been given the opportunity to go to Tanzania with a Scottish charity called The Vine Trust in June 2026.

Vine Trust School Expeditions are an opportunity for students to make a real and lasting difference to Tanzanian communities living in poverty. Working closely with in-country partners, volunteers construct individual family homes for some of the world's most vulnerable people - providing shelter, security and hope, and empowering communities to achieve a brighter future.



On our trip we will be staying in Moshi and helping to build brick houses for the local people.

This will be a fantastic experience of meeting and visiting another culture whilst learning skills for the future. We have to raise our own funds to pay for the Expedition. I have done a Hill trek to Beinn a' Ghlo', a distance of 22km taking in 3 munroes. We have done a plant sale and are planning a quiz night in September. Then in January I hope to run a fundraising Bingo afternoon tea in the Church. We have to raise over £3000.
