Rev. Fiona reflects

Friends, last weekend, Perth was full of people, music, laughter and lights, lots of bright lights. Yes, it was the Christmas Lights' Switch On. There was a buzz about the city centre as local bands and dancers took to the stages to entertain the crowds, Santa and his elves received lots of little visitors with their Christmas requests, and businesses and craftspeople attempted to keep warm as they sold their wares from gazebos and cabins. St Matthew's Church in conjunction with the Council offered hospitality and care for the performers on the main stage and staff members who needed a warm drink to keep them going during their shifts. It was a wonderful celebration of community and a lovely preparation for Christmas.



As a family, we enjoyed a wander through the festivities before helping at the church. After Calum visited Santa, the man himself wished me a 'Merry Christmas.' As I found myself responding in the appropriate way, I realised it felt too soon. Each year, it feels as though our preparations for Christmas begin earlier and that's certainly the case when the Christmas lights are switched on before stepping into Advent. It feels like we are always thinking a step ahead these days. Before Halloween has even taken place, the Advent calendars are creeping into the shops and, as a ministry friend pointed out, the eggs and flour are already on the shelves and it's nowhere near Shrove Tuesday! Are we too eager to get to Christmas? Do we need to slow down to appreciate the present?

Advent is traditionally a time of waiting and anticipation. It is a time to prepare our hearts and minds to renew the welcome to Jesus into our lives. I sometimes wonder if we are too quick to reach for the Christmas carols and too desperate to get to the celebration part. However, as I looked at the Christmas lights brightening the sky and the Christmas cheer brightening up folk's faces, I realised that there is a deep desire for Christmas to come into our community. Maybe Christmas isn't just for Christmas... At a time when there is so much discontent in society, why wouldn't we desire hope, peace, joy and love to come? At a point where there is frustration about education, the NHS, social work and the state of institutions, including the church, we need a beacon to lighten the darkness. We need Jesus. We need even more people to carry the Christ-light for those in need. In John 1:5, we read, "The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it." We need to be the light-bearers. We need to share the hope that Christ brings into our lives. God is with us, alleluia!

There has been much hope and light in the St Matthew's church family this busy and wonderful year. We've celebrated three baptisms and one wedding. We've welcomed nine new members by transfer of membership certificate, and six new Elders. On Sunday 30th November, we'll be welcoming three more Elders and several people will be proclaiming their faith thereby becoming members of our church. This is good news. We've welcomed a new Session Clerk, Marjorie Clark, and a new Treasurer, Craig Robson. We've appointed all of our Team Leaders, had our first Kirk Session Executive meeting and we're going to be recruiting team members to help us develop our work in the areas of Faith and Worship; Pastoral Care; Mission and Outreach; Social and Fellowship; Communications; Finance and Admin; Property; and Facilities Management.

More than all of that, we have been growing together as a church family: getting to know one another better, taking care of each other, exploring faith together, and taking the love and acceptance we experience in our church family out into our communities. This is church and it is good news. We are light-bearers and messengers of hope.

Of course, the year has not all been light. There has been sadness as we have lost loved ones and worry as several people in our church family have undergone big operations. Along with this, there have been the usual ups and downs of family life and church life. Yet through it all, God has been with us, comforting, supporting and guiding us.

As we celebrate this Christmas and beyond that, welcome in another new year, may we be reminded that there is light in the darkness. We have hope. God is with us and God will continue to be at our side as we journey onwards. Merry Christmas and a blessed New Year when it comes.

Sunday 30th November, 11.00, Worship for the First Sunday in Advent: Hope including the ordination and/or admission of new Elders and admission of new members

Chrissie – I enjoy everything to do with nature and wildlife. I loved walking, but it's a bit difficult now with my bad joints. I spend a lot of time gardening. I also enjoy reading and have made new friends through a local book group. I used to ski and when we had horses I loved riding.

What is the most surprising thing about you that we might not yet know?

Chris – I had leukaemia and a bone marrow transplant from an older brother. So, the last 40 years have been a bonus. I count myself a very fortunate man!

Chrissie – I played in an orchestra in the Albert Hall at 10 years of age.
